- 2. Current Certification by the American Nurses Credentialing Center or an equivalent body or be actively seeking certification and obtain the same on the first examination for which he/she is eligible.
- 3. Current active licensure to practice as an advanced practice registered nurse in the NP category in the state of Iowa.
- 4. Professional liabilty insurance coverage issued by a recognized company and of a type and in an amount equal to or greater than the limits established by the governing body.
- 5. Required previous experience: Applicants for initial appointment must be able to demonstrate provision of care, treatment or services reflective of the scope of privileges requested to at least 25 inpatients in the past 12 months, or completion of master's or post master's degree program in the past 12 months.

REAPPOINTMENT CRITERIA:

To be eligible to renew privilegs as a Category I Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioner, the applicant must meet the following maintenance of privilege criteria:

- 1. Current demonstrated competence and an adequate volume of experience in 50 cases reflective of the acute care population servied (i.e. inpatient, skilled nursing, home visits, hospice, etc.) with acceptable results in the privileges requested for the past 24 months based on results of ongoing professional practice evaluation and outcomes.
- 2. Evidence of current ability to perform privileges requested is required of all applicants for renewal of privileges.
